Created in 1985 by concerned citizens of Arlington and Alexandria, Bridges to Independence works in coordination with public agencies, businesses and community groups to give homeless people the support, shelter, counseling and employment training they need to regain self-sufficiency. ### Offender Aid & Restoration (OAR)

OAR of Arlington, Alexandria, and Falls Church believes in second chances. OAR works on behalf of the community in (1) Reentry: supporting men and women returning to our community from incarceration and (2) Community Service: offering alternative sentencing options for youth and adults. The Reentry support begins pre-release, as OAR offers courses and case management inside the Arlington County Detention Facility, as well as other local correctional facilities. OAR continues to work with men and women post-release by providing the following assistance: emergency services (such as food, clothing, transportation, and housing referrals), employment services (such as resume building, practicing interview skills, and searching for and applying for jobs online), and intensive case management.
